- Arrange health awareness programmes for prevention and control of diseases, especially in the poor localities.
- Reach out to patients of far flung areas through mobile dispensaries and organizing Medical Camps.
- Any other Project/activity, inline with the Mission and Objectives of the Trust.

THE PERSPECTIVE

Founded by Lt Gen Ghulam Muhammad Malik (Retd) Al Mustafa Trust made a humble start on 5th Sep 1998 house din a small building provided by a Philanthropist free of any rent. Ever since, the Trust has moved a long way making an unparalleled progress, now having 22 medical centres (7 urban, 15 in rural areas),21 dispensaries and mobile units, thus providing free primary health care facilities in 86 cities, towns and villages across the country. The number of beneficiaries treated during 2020 stands at 816,591, a slight decrease from 2019 figures of 942,605. A Glance through history of our performance would reveal enhanced figures of beneficiaries every year, this decrease is mainly due to COVID-19 crisis leading to frequent lockdowns in the country where people preferred to stay home. Despite closure of OPDs in public and private health care sector and simmering effects of Coronavirus, our health care facilities (barring few) remained functional throughout and kept on providing medical care to the poor and the needy across the country.

Besides registration with Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP), the Trust is also registered with UK Charity Commission and the state of Virginia, USA

NEW EQUIPMENT AND FACILITIES

Details of Some of the equipment that we received from World Philanthropic Organization and from within the country are given below:-

- New Mobile Units. "Hope Foundation", provided us an additional mobile unit for Medical Centre Lahore, which after refurbishment was made operational. AMAN Foundation also donated an ambulance to Medical Center Goth Haji Nabi Bakhsh to be utilized as mobile unit. Availability of these mobile units has added to our 'Reach Out Policy' to far flung rural areas
- Eye Equipment. Additional set of eye equipment was purchased with 50% cost paid by Bait ul Mall, however it has not been installed at Karachi as the facility is already available nearby under LRBT. It will thus be installed at some other suitable location
- Dental Care Equipment: Equipment for a modern Dental Centre, donated by 'We Care' (Germany) having two surgeries and a modern X-Ray unit was installed at MMC Korangi Karachi.

PROCESS OF COMPUTERIZATION

In Al Mustafa Trust computerization process started in 2015 however, it gained momentum in 2019. Initially a pilot project was deployed at Mehmoodabad Karachi. The software started with basic modules of registration, General OPD and Pharmacy (partial) only. Later the software was deployed in Korangi Karachi in Mar 2020, in Chaklala Scheme-III Rwp in Apr 2020 and Clifton Karachi in July 2020. After this deployment OPDs like Eye, Physiotherapy and Dental were added in software. Additionally services like Ultrasound, X-ray and ECG were also computerized. Having computerized Pharmacy module, Lab was also computerized to include billing services, testing and integration with OPD module.

After having completed above mentioned modules, data-sync module was started in Nov 2020 to sync data of all 4 IT enabled centres with servers at Head Office as well as Software House. This has resulted in provision of centralized reports of our medical centres and regions at Head Office for better management, decision making and visibility.

This process of computerization has resulted in better patient management, patient history, transparency, systematic billing and paperless environment. Work on Financial Module, Procurement and Payroll modules is in-progress.

COVID-19 vs AMT

- Despite Corona pandemic and resultant frequent lockdowns which affected most of the health care facilities in the country, Al Mustafa Trust waded its way through and remained functional in this hour of crisis. Operation of mobile dispensaries however, had to be suspended as people in the localities they visited, did not adhere to Corona SOPs. Some medical centres in Sindh had also to be closed for a brief period of time owing to COVID-19, however, they also became operational after few weeks. We acknowledge the dedication of those doctors who continued to take care of poor and needy sick people in these critical times. For purpose of safety, we procured Special Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), LASER thermometers, sanitizers and masks for our medics.
- Fund Raising Efforts Under Corona Environment. We were unable to hold any fund raising session/ function due to Coronavirus. Our drive to approach Trust's regular and other donors through personal letters, leaflets and social media proved quite fruitful to meet our recurring expenditure on medicines and facilities to our beneficiaries.
- Beyond the Mandate. Our mandate notwithstanding and on special requests by our worthy donors, following measures were taken by Al Mustafa Trust in certain pandemic infested areas.
 - Distribution of rations to the poor and jobless persons.
 - Distribution of 33,000 Soaps bars, provided by Life Buoy Company
 - More than Rs 10 million cash, provided by all Pakistan Physicians and Surgeons (APPS) – UK, were distributed amongst deserving jobless people, as advised by APPS – UK.
- Financial Assistance to Poor patients. A sum of Rs 2,426,654/- was spent from Pasha Fund (named after our worthy donor Mr. Pasha who donates a sizeable amount every year for treatment of patients that AMT is unable to handle), on treatment of certain Cancer, Hepatitis-C patients and delivery cases.

NEW HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

We broadened the base of our activities by completing following projects during the year 2020.

- Medical Centre Rera Bagh (AK). It has been functioning as a dispensary since 22 Mar 2018, later however, after donation of Minhas Trust' building to Al Mustafa Trust, it was converted into medical centre on 15 Jan 2020. This marked our first foot print in Azad Kashmir.
- Kot Jattan Bhimber (AK). 'Rehmat Nawab Memorial Trust Hospital', at village Kot Jattan, Bhimber (AK), was built by grandson of Ch Rehmat in his (grandfather's) memory and donated to Al Mustafa Trust. On 1 Mar 2020 it was converted into AMT medical centre.
- Qamar Mashani Mianwali. This dispensary, donated and constructed by Lt Gen Muhammad Ahsan Mehmood (Retd) and Brig Nasrullah Niazi (Retd), became operational on 1 Mar 2020.
- Dispensary Babini Mardan. Cost of the building was borne by Late Mr Muhammad Ahmed. Originally planned and constructed as medical centre, it started functioning as dispensary in September 2020. Its formal inauguration however, awaits improvement in Coronavirus situation in the country. As originally planned It is likely to be upgraded to medical centre by 1st quarter of 2021.
- Dispensary at Sangjani Rawalpindi. Donated by Mr Asad Mashhadi, the remodeling / renovation and furnishing of the building is complete. It will be functional by Mar 21.

UPCOMING HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

Construction of following ten health care units is at various stages of progress which is going to further broaden the canvas of our activities, thus enhanced facilities at the door steps of our beneficiaries.

- Medical Centre Garsheen Hassan Abdal. Donated by Col Zafar Cheema (Retd), grey structure of the building has been completed, remaining work continues.
- Green City Malir Karachi. Donated by Mr. Hanif Gohar, construction of this multi storey building started in Nov 20 and is progressing well.
- Ali Pur Chathha. This dispensary has been donated by Mr Nazir Mirza, construction of the building is nearing completion.
- **Dispensary at Khanewal.** Donated by Brig Waseem (Retd), construction of building is almost complete and it will be operational by Feb 21.
- Dispensary at Chhalgari Matiari Hyderabad. land was donated by Mr. Tariq Zaidi, construction of the building is in progress with assistance of Mr Akhtar Adil, a donor from Karachi. Building's ground floor has been completed and masonry work for the rest continues.
- Dispensary at Mehran Town Karachi. Donated by Mr. Abdul Malik and family, building construction is complete. Inauguration will be done soon on improvement of COVID-19 situation in Karachi.
- Sohawa Diwalian Chakwal. This medical centre has been donated by Sqn Ldr Abbas (Retd), 80% construction has been completed.

- Medical centre at Faisalabad. Donated by Brig Maqbool (Retd), construction of the building is nearing completion
- Pajja gai Peshawar. Land for this medical centre was donated by Mr Shahid Hussain, building construction is in progress. The existing medical centre is in a rented house and will be shifted to new building early next year.
- Medical Centre Alam Abad Swabi. Donated by 'Rashid Memorial Welfare Organization' in collaboration with PAF. Construction of building is underway.

Transfer of Land. Sizeable plots at following locations have been donated and transferred in the name of Al Mustafa Trust. Construction of buildings will be undertaken at an appropriate time; OGDCL Colony – Rawalpindi sponsored by Mr. Muhammad Akram Khan; Gujranwala (Sui Road) sponsored by Mian Muhammad Javed and Azeem Pur, Rahim Yar Khan sponsored by Mr Jam Allah Ditta;










Al Mustafa Trust Existing Network
